As we enter into another year of recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, we are proud to present the successful accomplishments of Parents Alliance Employment Project (PAEP). This past year, our board of directors worked diligently to revisit our long range plan and identify the following goals to ensure the continued growth of the agency: 1) to continue to offer programs and services that enhance consumer choice, 2) to expand awareness of PAEP services and accomplishments, 3) to develop PAEP business relationships, 4) to develop and maintain financial support of PAEP, 5) to strengthen PAEP through active leadership roles, 6) to enhance professional opportunities to staff to promote a positive working environment, and 7) to address technology needs.





GROWTH






