

At a time when uncertainty reigns due to COVID-19, we are pleased to share that the overall headline of Parents Alliance Employment Project (PAEP) is both a positive and successful one. In the last two years, PAEP has experienced great accomplishments and tremendous growth including:

- Increased revenue by 52%
- Expanded services into 4 additional county areas
- Partnered with over 100 new businesses to increase diversity and create job opportunities for people with disabilities
- Placed over 180 individuals with disabilities into sustained, meaningful employment

Amid the disruption of COVID-19, we quickly realized that, now more than ever- our people need us. They need their jobs, they need support, they need connection. 


Weet Billy, a behind the scenes hero!

Northwestern Medicine has partnered with Parents Alliance Employment Project for a third time to bring Project SEARCH to McHenry County! In total, Northwestern Medicine has partnered with PAEP to bring Project SEARCH to three of their hospitals: Central DuPage Hospital in 2014, Delnor Hospital in Geneva in 2016, and Woodstock Hospital in Woodstock in 2020. Program start-up efforts began early fall of 2019 where all partners came together: Northwestern Medicine, Parents Alliance Employment Project, McHenry County College, The Illinois Department of Human Services: Division of Rehabilitation Services, and The McHenry County Workforce Network. With full support from the leadership of Woodstock Hospital's President, Matt Carlen, and Human Resources Business Partner, Anne Haslinger, PAEP has been able to secure ten internship opportunities for eight participants in Woodstock's inaugural year. As a result of the program, individuals with disabilities will gain work skills that will lead to gainful employment. As the program continues to grow, Matt Carlen has suggested that expanding to other NM Facilities within McHenry County could provide more opportunities for diversity and inclusion. As Lead Employability Instructor, Sarah Basit and Employment Specialist, Shannon Ciezadlo represent PAEP, they are committed to bringing a high quality of services to the McHenry county area and inspiring local businesses to hire more people with disabilities!
